

## **Bicycle Safety Education Prevents Accidents**

Schools and communities across America are encouraging physical activity such as walking and biking and also making strong efforts to teach safe practices since both can also be dangerous. Children under 16 account for a disproportionate number of both pedestrian and bicyclist injuries and fatalities. Boys also have a much higher rate of both injuries and fatalities than girls do.

### **Solutions:**

Many schools are incorporating bicycle safety courses into physical education curriculum and/or hosting annual bicycle safety events. These solutions are implemented with the help of parent volunteers, interested teachers, and trained professionals. The first step is to organize a Safe Routes to School Team at your school.
