Key Topics:

Sustainability in Implementation – Practical strategies for addressing sustainability issues (organizational issues, funding, communication with constituencies, etc.).

Environmental Change Strategies -- Planning and implementing environmental strategies at the local level with an emphasis on Social Marketing and Social Norms and Media Campaigns.

Planning and Implementing Evaluation Strategies – Developing detailed evaluation plans; selecting key indicators; collecting, analyzing and effectively applying process and outcome data.

Cultural Competency – Integrating cultural competency throughout all phases of SPF with an emphasis on rural and socioeconomic factors specific to Vermont communities.

Advocacy – On-going local and state level advocacy skills and education.
